The first annual Broughton Alumni Association Scholarship will be awarded this year in the name of Charles (Gig) Lloyd. Gig was a Broughton student during the late '40's and passed away a year and a half ago. Some of his classmates and friends contributed approximately \$4,000 for the purpose of awarding a scholarship in his name. It was decided to coordinate this with the Alumni Association and make it the first award.

The criteria for the scholarship are as follows:

I. Award

A. Plaque

1. Individual plaque presented to recipient at annual awards assembly.
2. Permanent plaque at Broughton listing yearly recipients.

B. Financial Award

1. Student will receive up to \$1,000.00 per year for a maximum of four years.

II. Conditions of Eligibility:

- A. Broughton High School graduate.
- B. Student not receiving another substantial award.
