2013 Distinguished Alumni Award

The NBHS Alumni Association is proud to announce that William Ewart Easterling, Jr., MD ('49), a nationally renowned physician, educator, and medical administrator, is the recipient of its 2013 Distinguished Alumni Award.

Dr. Easterling earned his bachelor's degree from Duke University where he was an Angier B. Duke Scholar. He received his MD from UNC-Chapel Hill. He then joined the US Air Force, serving in the Medical Corps as a Captain and Chief of Obstetrics & Gynecology at the Stewart Air Force Base hospital. After his tour of duty with the Air Force, Dr. Easterling completed a US Public Health traineeship in reproductive physiology at UCLA. In 1964 he joined the faculty of UNC where he remained until his retirement in 1999. He served UNC in a variety of capacities, including Professor, Associate Dean of Clinical Sciences, Dean of Continuing Medical Education and Alumni Affairs, Acting Dean of the UNC School of Medicine, and Chief of Staff of UNC Hospitals. During a career in Chapel Hill that spanned four decades, his leadership helped the medical school become one of the world's outstanding research and teaching facilities.

Dr. Easterling was a member of numerous national organizations. He chaired committees for the Association of American Medical Colleges, the American College of Obstetrics and Gynecology, and the Council of Resident

Education in Obstetrics and Gynecology. He was President of the Society of Medical College Directors of Continuing Medical Education, the Robert A. Ross Obstetrical and Gynecological Society, and the NC Chapter of the American Cancer Society. He was a recipient of the Distinguished Medical Alumni Faculty Award from the UNC School of Medicine, and he was recognized by Marquis *Who's Who in America* as a notable professional.

Our distinguished alumnus passed away in 2011. In his obituary, Ellyn Easterling stated that her husband was deeply spiritual and valued contributing time to his church and community more than any professional accomplishment. Dr. Easterling was active in many facets of his church, serving as Senior Warden, Treasurer, and CEO. For nearly 40 years, he was a member of the Board of Directors of the Penick Village Episcopal Home for the Aging. As President of the Board for this continuing care retirement community, he was instrumental in directing the largest expansion in Penick Village's history.

William Easterling served his country, state, church, and community. He helped lead the UNC School of Medicine and UNC Hospitals. He dedicated his life to meeting the needs of thousands of

North Carolinians. His efforts had a profound impact on the education of medical residents, the practice of medicine, and the treatment of gynecologic cancer. Every Tar Heel, Blue Devil, Demon Deacon, Wolfpacker, and Pirate in the Broughton community can cheer for our distinguished alumnus!





A number of years ago, family and friends of Mial Williamson (senior class president of the class of 1949) set up a scholarship fund in his memory. At some point along the way, the folks who were handling this scholarship asked the Alumni Association to make this award in the future. We did so and each year the Mial Williamson scholarship is awarded to an outstanding Broughton senior for his or her college education. It is currently a one-time \$3,500.00 scholarship award.

This past year, Bob Williamson, the last of five Williamson brothers passed away. (Following in his older brother's footsteps, Bob was the senior class president of the class of 1951.) The Alumni Association has received over \$30,000.00 in donations to the Mial Williamson scholarship in the last year. What a wonderful legacy! It is my hope that, eventually, we will be able to raise this stipend to \$5,000.00.

With support for the Mial Williamson scholarship leading the way, we can only

hope that the support for the Alumni Association scholarship will increase, as well. Recently, we raised this from \$2,000 a year to \$2,500 a year for a total of \$10,000.00 over the four years of a recipient's college career.

On another matter altogether, I am not sure that I thought that I would ever be able to say that I had graduated from Broughton "50 years ago", but that day is fast approaching. Knowing that my class takes the full measure of time to consider things, I thought that it would be a good idea to get started with our planning early. We had our first meeting 18 months before the date we think that we will have our reunion.

Our class has had a reunion every five years since we graduated so our contact list is reasonably up to date. However, and for whatever reason, as active as we have been, we have never had a class website. It fell to me to get our reunion planning going but when it comes to

websites, I will admit to being severely challenged.

Enter Steve Stephenson and Bill Hube of the Class of 1963. They are heading up their 50th class reunion later this year and they recommended a vendor who creates class websites. William (Bill) Rowland Honored

William (Bill) Rowland, Broughton, Class of 1947, recently was honored for his extensive work on the history of the Civil War in Lenoir County. He was presented the Order of the Long Leaf Pine, the state of North Carolina's highest prestigious award given by the Governor at the Queen Street United Methodist Church on September 23, 2012. Allen Bingham, pastor, is a 1980 graduate of NBHS.

Rowland, 84, is a retired DuPont technical engineer who worked at the company's Kinston textile plant from 1954 to 1987. He is also a history enthusiast who chronicled the excavation of the CSS Neuse Civil War gunboat in the early 1960's and has co-authored two books on the Neuse and the Battle of Wyse Fork in 1865.

With help from his children, Rowland unearthed an estimated 7,500 Civil War artifacts in Kinston and Lenoir County which he has donated to the state with the requirement that they be displayed in the local area. Plans are for them to make up the many exhibits in the CSS Neuse museum, which is presently under construction in downtown Kinston.

Rowland is a native of the Wake County town of Willow Spring, and attended Broughton. He dropped out in 1945 at age 17 to join the U.S. Navy toward the end of World War II. "I dropped out of high school because Uncle Sam was pointing his finger at me," he said.

Rowland served in the Navy for two years. He obtained his GED while stationed in Quantico, VA, and then enrolled at East Carolina Teachers College. He graduated in 1953 with a bachelor's degree in pre-dental and pre-medical science.

Bill has also had small parts in a number of movies. He played a basketball official in the 1996 film "Never Give Up: The Jimmy V Story."

Congratulations to William (Bill) Rowland on this outstanding recognition!

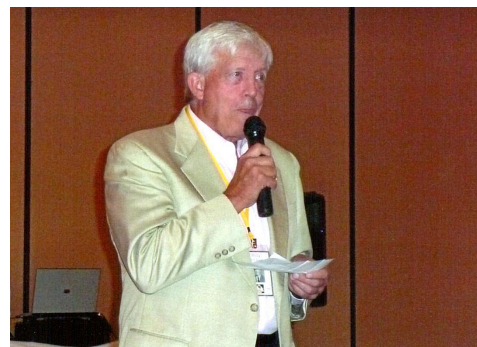

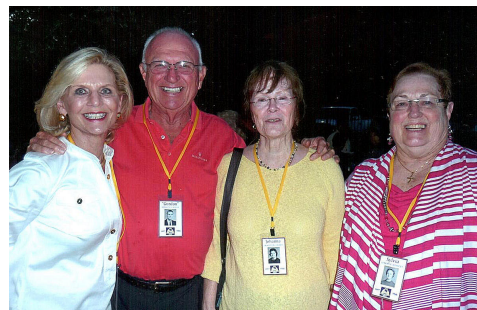

Happenings At Broughton

U.S. News and World Report is planning for their next *America's Best Colleges Guide*. One of the popular features has been the high school senior profiles that appear in the Guide and on their website. In the past they have even created videos of the students for the website. Essentially, a reporter talks with seniors who have gone through the college application process to find useful tips and strategies they employed (or didn't) as part of the college application process. They also highlight the school they visit. They said that when they choose the one high school in the country to spotlight for the Best Colleges Guide, they look for solid-performing, open-admission, and diverse high schools.

This year they have chosen Broughton High School! U.S. News and World Report interviewed 16 Broughton seniors

and 8 of those students will be highlighted in the next U.S. News and World Report's *America's Best Colleges Guide*.

Broughton High School was recently highlighted in the Washington Post's *America's Most Challenging High Schools* ranking. The Washington Post ranked Broughton as the 15th most rigorous school in North Carolina, the second highest public school in Wake County, and ranked us 602nd in the nation. The Washington Post's Challenging Index uses a combination of Advanced Placement and International Baccalaureate tests given in comparison to the number of seniors who graduated. Only 9% of the approximately 22,000 U.S. public high schools managed to reach the standard to earn a place on this list.

Broughton was also highly ranked in Newsweek's *America's Best High School*

rankings. Newsweek ranked Broughton High School as the 24th ranked school in North Carolina, the highest ranked high school in Wake County, and the 1,011th in the nation. Newsweek's rankings highlighted the best 2,000 public high schools in the nation—those that have proven to be the most effective in turning out college-ready grads. The list is based on six components: graduation rate (25 percent), college acceptance rate (25 percent), AP/IB/AICE tests taken per student (25 percent), average SAT/ACT scores (10 percent), average AP/IB/AICE scores (10 percent), and percent of students enrolled in at least one AP/IB/AICE course (5 percent).

At Broughton, Service Learning is also alive and well! In April our entire school participated in a Stop Hunger Now meal packaging event. During the day every
